After a brief stint in private practice, and in 1993, he took a volunteer job with the Jesuit Refugee Service, where he began to help the pre-screened Haitian refugees paroled from Guantanamo Naval Base at the Catholic Emergency Legal Aid for Haitians (CELAH/CLINIC). On June 1, 1994 he co-founded the G.W.L. Legal Project, which subsequently was restructured as Catholic Legal Services, Archdiocese of Miami, Inc., (CLS) when CLINIC-Miami merged with G.W.L. Legal Project. Randy currently serves as the Chief Executive Officer of the agency, interacts with heads of all departments & oversees their functions. He is a frequent speaker on asylum issues and immigration law and an advocate on behalf of immigrants’ rights. He has been recognized for his outstanding contributions to the field of immigration law, and tireless work on behalf of the immigrant and refugee community. He serves on the Board of CCLS. A Magna Cum Laude graduate of Harvard University, he earned his Juris Doctorate and Masters of Science in Social Work from the University of Wisconsin. He also attended the International Summer School for Refugee Studies Programme in Oxford University.
