Juvenile Committee, and Training Committee. Heidi served as the EOIR Litigation Report Coordinator, Training Coordinator, and on an SMD working group to develop training modules for new hires, until her promotion to Deputy Chief Counsel in 2016. Heidi currently supervises and manages a portfolio that includes: webcam and video-teleconference litigation in detained dockets; litigation in the Migrant Protection Protocol cases; the Appeals Committee, Case Analysis Response Team, and the Appellate Brief Committee; a paralegal as it relates to BIA matters; the NTA Review program; the Training program that includes in-house continuing education and a comprehensive training for new attorneys; several HQ working groups relating to SharePoint migration, NTA processing, and appeal tracking through PLAnet; and a non-detained litigation team of fourteen attorneys.
