Michael VASTINE joined the faculty of St. Thomas University in 2004, where he is Professor of Law and Director of the Immigration Clinic. Since 2011, he has served on the American Immigration Lawyers Association (AILA) South Florida Chapter Board of Directors, including as Chapter President (2018-19). He is current member of the AILA (National) Federal Litigation Section Steering Committee and Law Student Section Steering Committee, a past member of the AILA National Amicus Curiae Committee, and Annual Conference Planning Committee. His litigation includes the lead cases construing Padilla v. Kentucky in Florida (Hernandez v. State), and the Eleventh Circuit's application of the "categorical approach" to Florida drug convictions (Donawa v. U.S. Att'y Gen.; Choizilme v. U.S. Att'y Gen.). In 2013, Michael received the AILA National Elmer Fried Award for Excellence in Teaching. He is a graduate of Georgetown University Law Center.
